**The New York State Inclusive Recreation Resource Center**, founded in January 2007, has become a state-wide training resource for people with disabilities, recreation and outdoor education providers, tourism professionals, and students who want to learn how to achieve inclusion and accessibility at their sites and facilities.

Over 700 Certified Inclusivity Assessors across the state have worked to increase accessibility and inclusion.
